New and Old Business	 Nuisance wildlife policy was added to the SRPCG by-laws. The policy was sent to all plot holders, including WL plotholders. A formal communication will be sent to the gardener that committed a violation regarding treatment of wildlife in the garden. In 2025-2026 those gardeners that do not honor their work commitment to the garden will risk losing a year off of their plot lease. Gardeners will be expected to attend ALL 3 workdays AND the Annual Meeting. Garden commitments and obligations will be highlighted at the annual meeting. Reminders of commitment will be sent for each work day. Plot #'s will be posted on the bulletin board for those gardeners who are not abiding by their commitment. Those who do not fulfill their work commitment will lose a year off their 6 years lease. 	Steve
